## Colonel Commandant's Mid Year Report

To say that the last six months have been busy for a number of patriotic members is an understatement. The majority of activities have achieved my stated aim of enhancing mateship, welfare to each other and regaining lost "Corps Ethos" through greater awareness and dissemination of information about Corps activities in the Region. My motto for 2006 has been "*To Establish*", which has already been successfully met in a number of areas.

Firstly, the establishment of an annual Regional RAEME Remembrance Service with the highly successful "Inaugural RAEME Day of Remembrance" simultaneously held in Melbourne, Bandiana and Hobart on Sunday, 29 Jan 06, with over 200 members and their families attending the respective services, despite short notice and high temperatures. The project "*Finding RAEME*" continues to slowly add numbers to the Colonel Commandant's lists, but we still have a long way to go with over 2,000 still MIA. A successful reunion at "The Seymour Club" on 1 Feb 06, stimulated the formation of another motivated steering group to join the one in Bandiana, with both working hard to establish new regional Chapters of the RAV. I am most grateful for the self-sacrifice and support given by Andy Turner and his crew "Up North" and by Dave Maddick and his team in Seymour. Sadly it appears that the formation of a group for RAEME Vietnam Veterans has come to a standstill due to internal differences associated with the previously defunct National Association. Until these issues are resolved, it is not expected that there will be any further movement with this group.

Formal visits to four units over the last six months has established greater liaison and

awareness of the current maintenance situation. Visits to JLU (V) at Puckapunyal (formerly PWC) on 21 Feb 06 and Bandiana (formerly 4BWB) on 24 Feb 06 revealed the extent of CSP impact from the early 90s, when it was advised that only 15 ARA RAEME personnel are now responsible for 3<sup>rd</sup> and 4<sup>th</sup> line repairs in Victoria. Moreover, with nine attached to provide technical support for the School of Artillery, this means that only 6 ARA personnel are supervising contractual maintenance throughout Victoria compared to more than 1,000 in 1988. On 22 Feb 06 a Corps History presentation was given to a number of newly graduated RAEME Officers attending their LOBC Course. The opportunity to meet our future leaders was invaluable to hopefully instill "Esprit de Corps" plus reinforce that the Corps' future was in their hands.

I am grateful to COL Jim Phasey for permitting a visit to DTR-A on 17 Mar 06, as well as supporting the drive to increase Corps Ethos by the appointment on LTCOL Mick Buldo as the new Regional RAEME Rep. A downside to the excellent visit to 26 Tpt Sqn Wksp on 30 Mar 06, accompanied by LTCOL Buldo, was the revelation by CAPT Matt Brodie that this last remaining ARA Land Command unit in Victoria was moving north to Brisbane from mid 2007.

On 19 Mar 06 a Burma railway presentation was given as a prelude to the RAEME Widows Luncheon organised by the RAV at Oakleigh Barracks. The ANZAC pilgrimage to Thailand and Burma enabled wreaths to the 84 AEME POWs, who died during or after construction of the Burma railway, to be formally laid at both ends of the line. On a prorata basis, the loss of life by the Corps was therefore equivalent to that for 8<sup>th</sup> Division Infantry Units. Regrettably, these Corps tributes were the first by a senior RAEME officer, in over 63 years. The honour of laying

wreaths was further enhanced by the presence of 84 year old CFN Douglas Brazier (AEME and RAV member) who fought in the Pacific Islands in WW2 and is the last surviving member of his unit.

On 5 May 06 Jeff Bruhn held the annual Mafia Formal Dinner at the Vic Bks SGT's Mess attended by 65 members and guests. Due to my unfortunate absence in Burma, both BRIG David McGahey and LTCOL Mick Buldo confirmed that it had been a very enjoyable night and a rare opportunity to regain past pleasures for former serving members. A "welcome safely home from Burma" function at home on 21 May 06 was attended by 17 members and their wives or companions, who braved the cold to enjoy friendship mixed with the tastes of Asia provide by Sheila and myself. It also provided key members from different RAEME organisations the opportunity to establish new friendships or renew old ones for future activities. A trip to Townsville on 25-29 May 06 permitted a visit to Billabong Sanctuary to check on the well-being of CPL Sout "Snappa" Crock in her 21<sup>st</sup> year of service in RAEME as official mascot to 102 Fd Wksp (Lt). Re-granting of workshop names in CSSBs has guaranteed her ongoing career. Did anyone sign her up for DFRDB in 1985?

Apart from attending the re-vitalised RAT's Corps Birthday celebrations in Hobart on 11 Dec 06, I have just had the honour to attend the RAT's very successful "Inaugural Mixed Formal Dining -In Night" held at the Claremont RSL on 24 Jun 06. An attendance of 41 from less than 80 members spread throughout Tassie, is exceptional in these days of growing apathy. The tables were decked out at the RSL to a high standard equivalent to any Mess due the efforts of "Pop" Barrett and his "backroom" helpers. After hours of hard work, John "Lurch" Lennox provided fascinating entertainment throughout the

night with an impressive lite-pro show of historical RAEME pictures from bygone days in Tasmania.

Ongoing promotion of "**The Craftsman of the Year**" Award over recent months seems to be bearing fruit with indications that a greater number of nominations will be made in 2006 than in the last few years. For example, 2 FSB have already indicated they will be nominating for both ARA and GRES categories.

## Calling Army Apprentices.



This year has seen the formation of the AUSTRALIAN ARMY APPRENTICES ASSOCIATION (AAAA).

The AAAA's first committee meeting is in Canberra in July 06 where all manner of business will be discussed to ensure the proper running of the AAAA.

Some of the proposed objectives of the Association are:

- To provide welfare support to ex-Army Apprentices and their spouses as feasible and deemed necessary.
- To encourage the Army to train it's own tradespersons.
- To support the Ordnance Museum at Bandianna to display memorabilia from the Army Apprentices Schools.
- To ensure the long term existence and maintenance of the Marine Gates.
- To encourage the writing and publishing of the history of the Army Apprentices School
- To ensure recognition of the work and sacrifices of ex-Apprentices by means of memorials, plaques and public awareness.
- To maintain social contacts with ex-Apprentices by encouraging intake

and School reunions and social events.

- To maintain links with organizations of similar aims.
- To provide a web page to disseminate information, both to membership and the wider audience.

## Australian Defence medal



It is estimated that over one million serving and ex-serving ADF members will be eligible for the medal.

Ex-serving personnel who have served for four years (or have completed a lesser initial enlistment period) either as an ADF Regular or Reserve member since the end of World War II (3 September 1945) are eligible for the medal.

Eligibility for the medal has been extended to those personnel who:

- have died in service; or
- have been medically discharged with a compensatory impairment at the time of their discharge, thus rendering them unable to serve the required minimum qualifying period; or
- have honorably served but, due to some Defence workplace enlistment policies of the time (as determined by the Chief of the Defence Force), were unable to serve the required minimum qualifying period.

National servicemen will also be eligible for the ADM, as the completion of their National Service obligation will be considered as completion of an initial enlistment period of service.

Experience with determining eligibility has shown that ex-Regular Army personnel are being processed from information from the defence database and is somewhat automatic. Eligibility for Ex-Reserve personnel must be proven by the individual as computer records only go back to 1986. Personnel with a combination of both Regular and Reserve service are a bit hit and miss and essentially, unless you have received advice that the medal is to be issued, submit your application together with documentary evidence. If you are unsure send me (in my official capacity as SO2 (SCM) at APA-H), any details about yourself, service number and approximate dates is normally all I need to go on. Send

your requests in writing so I remember,  
telephone calls I forget.
