Colonel Commandant's Mid Year Report –2007

Since my last report there have been outstanding developments within the region. The Bandiana, Seymour/Puckapunyal and **RAEME** Vietnam Veterans - Southern groups have all been presented with their "Charters" as Chapters of the separate **RAEME** Association of Victoria (RAV). The RAEME Association of Tasmania (RAT) continues to grow after their outstanding inaugural "Mixed Dinner" held at the Claremont RSL in Jun 06. The RAT Committee has followed up with successful Corps Birthday celebrations and ANZAC Day activities this year. It is hoped that both LTCOL Mick Buldo and I will be able to attend this year's RAT Formal Dinner to be held on 7 Jul 07, to make up for our inability to attend their Corps Birthday activities last year. The RAV held its last Colonel Commandant's Corps Birthday Dinner on 1 Dec 06. The night was a great success with 81 attending along with BRIG David McGahey and his lovely wife Sue, as Guest of Honour - in recognition of David's tremendous contribution to the Corps over the last four years as Head of Corps (HOC). BRIG David Welch and LTCOL Nick Stanton, as the new Head of Corps and Deputy respectively, have big

shoes to fill with both BRIG McGahey and LTCOL Andy Adams' departure.

An interesting aspect of last year's dinner was the fact that over 1/3 of the guests were not yet members of the RAV. Bandiana successfully trialled a twilight service to overcome the problems temperatures. high Exercises commitments unfortunately prevented the attendance of personnel from Melbourne based ARES Units at the Shrine. LTCOL Craig Atkins and former MAJ Colin Galvin are to be highly commended for bring along their entire families to participate in this unique commemoration service for the Corps. Their commitment and dedication of 84 year old Doug Brazier, who drove himself to the Shrine on this hot day, demonstrated the true spirit of the Corps, which those not attending without just reason, have obviously lost or never had. It was particularly disappointing to see the lack of so-called friends of CAPT Paul Lawton who failed to support his finance, Catriona Campbell whilst she laid his cross in the grounds of the Shrine under the RAEME Tree of Remembrance. At least her Father flew down from Canberra and her Grandfather was present to help her new RAEME "Mates" to support her both at the service and at the Emerald Hotel afterwards. Anyway, well done Jeff and all concerned with the 2007 Mafia Dinner and my appreciation to you and LTCOL Mick Buldo for all your support throughout the year. However despite developments on most fronts, sadly it appears that the RAEME Vietnam Veterans-Southern Chapter is still plagued with bickering over the disestablishment of the previously "defunct" National RAEME Vietnam Vets Association and distribution of funds, which will undoubtly end up destroying the autonomy of this group - if a resolution is not found quickly between warring fractions. The end of the year will also sadly see the disappearance of the last ARA RAEME Workshop in the Region when 26 Tpt Sqn Wksp re-locates to Brisbane.

This does not mean that ARES units with ARA staff will have an easy time to win the Regional ARA Craftsman of the Year Award, as your nominations must still meet the high standard required for this prestigious award. Ongoing promotion last year resulted in four nominations in 2006, two ARA and two ARES, the highest result in decades. An outstanding achievement and all units concerned are to be highly

commended for their effort, especially as the standard of the reports were exceptional, thereby resulting in the Region winning the National Award for ARES Craftsman of the Year. It was particularly pleasing to see this important Award go to the Apple Isle after years of apparent neglect and inactivity. Which reminds me that reports have to be raised in just over a month's time.
