HOC CELL – UPDATE FROM CORPS RSM

Introduction. The Corps RSM, WO1 Jon Tynan, issues monthly updates on Corps matters – the RAT is pleased to feature excerpts from these important communications for our readers.

"Corps Conference location for 2024 is 3 BDE Townsville. This year's conference will focus on work occurring around the restructure of the ADF, including base asset; how the BDE COMD sees the BDE being employed; and for those, who may not have the chance to attend previously, an opportunity to do so.



"At the time of drafting this email, the dates are as follows:

- 01 Oct All ranks BBQ dinner
- 02 Oct Day 1 of conference
- 03 Oct Day 2 of conference (mid-afternoon finish all ranks dining-in night)

"The Corps RSM will release a 'Warning Order" shortly with the agenda and admin detail. The BDE ASM (WO1 Goninan) and WO2 Askew will complete the relevant administration requirements with assistance from HOC Cell.

"**Key Corps Points**. A little-known fact is the range of positions available to Corps members via the link below:

• Overseas Postings. Pages - Overseas Postings is a one stop shop for all information on preparing an application for an overseas posting. This link will also take numerous positions available for CFN up to WO1 (especially our Aviation brethren). As always, make sure you use the chain of command for advice and guidance. Make sure when checking for positions you filter for 'Any Corps & RAEME'.

Matt Stone Racing Team. The affiliation with Matt Stone Racing has got off to a flying start in 2024, with ASEME providing two JNCOs integrated into the crew for the Bathurst Race Weekend 22-25 Feb 24. WO1 Ben Munro has been in consultation with ASMs in all regions IOT to inform persons interested in being part of the program. Please go through your ASMs to have your name put forward.

"Craftsman Magazine. There has been a fantastic response for articles for the next edition of the magazine, with the Editor, Dave Clarke, expressing his gratitude to those who have taken the time to submit articles. Dave will commence putting the magazine together for release later this year.

"Corps Shop. The shop is live Welcome to HOC Corps Shop (raeme.org.au), Please continue to provide feedback IOT for the Corps Cell to build a stock of items you want to see for sale

"RAEME Corps Awards. Please consider nominations for the awards. The Corps RSM will release more information relating to the changes within the relevant Corps Instruction.

"Development of ECN 222, the Marine Technician trade has progressed to a point where ASEME has a basic understanding of the training requirement for in-service transfer and IET. In summary:

- In-service transfer for 'big boat' qualified pers (83 within Army) will be considered. Those pers will receive an offer to trade transfer once the L8710 workforce plan is approved and Army Position Numbers (APN) are converted to ECN 222 Marine Technician. This will be merit based (lead by Workforce and Training Group and offer distributed by CMA). At this point in time, the 'Gap' training for transfer into the category will be minimal (based on qualifications and currency).
- In-service transfers (fully qualified) will not incur a 'ROSO'

HOC Cell – Update from CORP RSM Cont.

• The analysis for Introduction into service (IIS) training for L8710 Littoral Manoeuvre capability is still to be conducted for the new Landing Craft Medium – LC-M (details here), Landing Craft Heavy – LC-H and Amphibious Vehicle - Logistics – AV-L.

"Development of ECN 418 – Energy Technicians with Auto Elec qualification. It seems there is some confusion surrounding the employment of ECN 418 for rectifying Auto Elec issues. Auto Elec is no longer taught as part of the ECN 418 IET continuum; however, this does not automatically preclude already qualified technicians (deemed competent during their IET) from conducting analysis, repair or replacement, as their qualification remains extant. If wishing to mitigate risk, ASMs can assess and provide Tech Authority.

"Workforce and Training Group. The W&TG web page has been updated with information on each of the employment categories. See Workforce and Training Group - Maintenance. The Manual of Army Employments RAEME page with your employment specification has changed and is now here.

"W&TG are working on the new Land Engineering Officer Employment Specification to simplify and clarify the management of RAEME Ground Officers. LEO are currently managed under the Logistics Officer ES with an excessive number of skill grades."

VALE TO A LEADER – Brigadier Herbert W Barker

On 17 Jun 2024, our Corps lost one of its founding members, Brigadier Herbert "Bert" Barker.

He passed in Melbourne, aged 102. Until recently, Bert was a resident in aged care at Banora Point on the Gold Coast, moving back to Melbourne to be closer to family, he was focused on making sure his wife Nona was settled in the Victorian retirement village with their daughter. They would have celebrated their 80th wedding anniversary on the 15th July and Nona, herself a WWII veteran, turns 100 on the 31st of October this year.



BRIG Bert belongs to a rare cohort of servicemen because he was an original member of our proud Corps at our foundation in 1942. He served in WWII on operations in PNG and through his many postings, his various commands, training and staff appointments over 33 years' service, it is clear he made a huge contribution to the Corps, the Army and the ADF. He served as Colonel Commandant 1 Military District from 1980 to 1984 before retiring.

The following tribute was written in 2021 to mark BRIG Bert's 100th birthday.



Vale to a leader – Brigadier Herbert W Barker Cont.

BRIG Herbert "Bert" W Barker (Retd) joined the Army in 1941, following completion of the second year of a Bachelor of Electrical Engineering course at Melbourne University. Although he didn't complete his degree, he had Previously completed a Diploma of Mechanical Engineering, and as a result, he was allocated to Australian Army Ordnance Corps (AAOC), as a Private. He then attended an Infantry Officer Training Course at Bonegilla. Bert was commissioned in June 1942 and appointed to raise and command 320 Aust LAD attached to a major Signals unit at Balcombe, Victoria. A short time later, while attending an Ordnance Mechanical Engineering Wireless Course at the AAOC School, Broadmeadows, Victoria, he was transferred to the newly formed AEME Corps on 1 Dec 42. He celebrated his 21st birthday on 13 Dec 42. Lieutenant, and later, Captain Barker, spent most of his time at Oatlands Golf Course, Parramatta, then the Atherton Tablelands (1943) before heading to New Britain in 1944, where he served with 1 Infantry Troops Workshops till War's end.

Post WW2, BRIG Bert continued his service in several workshop postings in Australia until 1950, when he was sent to UK for two and a half years, to attend the Long Electronics Courses at REME Training Centre. He attended Army Staff College, Queenscliff, Victoria, in 1956 and was appointed CO & CI RAEME Training Centre from 1959 – 64.

After three years as DDEME Eastern Command, Bert was promoted to Brigadier and appointed as Chief Superintendent Army Design Establishment (ADE),

After three years as DDEME Eastern Command, Bert was promoted to Brigadier and appointed as Chief Superintendent Army Design Establishment (ADE), Maribyrnong, Victoria. He served for a further three years until resigning from the Army in 1974. During his time at ADE, he took part in the Rapier trials in Darwin.

In his subsequent civilian career, BRIG Bert worked as Regional Engineering Manager for STC, 1975, the Boy Scout Jamboree Executive Officer and CEO of Australian Fire Protection Association, each for about a year before relocating from Melbourne to a warmer climate in Northern NSW in late 1977. He served as Colonel Commandant 1 Military District from 1980 to 1984.

Bert married Nona in 1944, and they have three daughters, six grandchildren and eight great grandchildren.

He and Nona live in Darlington Retirement Village, Banora Point, NSW. Whilst Nona receives full time care, he enjoys semi-care in the same facility and is still driving his car and routinely attends local RAQ events.

Vale to a leader – Brigadier Herbert W Barker Cont.

Bert turned 100 on 13 Dec 21. BRIG Bert belongs to a rare surviving cohort of servicemen, not just because they are closing in on their 100th Birthdays, but also because they are original members of the proud Corps of RAEME, which will celebrate its 80th Birthday in December 2022. Bert is indeed a pioneer of the Corps and through his many postings, his various commands, training and staff appointments, over 33 years' service, it is clear he made a huge contribution to the Corps, the Army and the ADF.

BRIG Bert is much admired by his peers but also by those members of the Corps who came later. Most recently, he has been an inspiration to a new generation of RAEME servicemen and women (serving and retired), as an active member of RAEME Association Queensland, where he regularly attends its many activities and lunches in Brisbane, and on the Gold and Sunshine Coasts. Congratulations Bert on this most important Anniversary.



DVA NEWS - AN ESO PEAK BODY - TELL DVA WHAT YOU THINK

DVA is working with the veteran community to develop options for a new Ex-Service Organisation (ESO) Peak Body that meets the needs of veterans, families, ESOs and other organisations providing veterans and families with advocacy support.



DVA NEWS Cont.

An independent ESO Peak Body has the potential to become a unified and representative voice to strengthen advocacy across the ESO sector on issues affecting veterans and veteran families. By fostering consensus and collaboration, it would help to streamline consultation processes, reducing duplication of efforts.

To ensure DVA get this right, an ESO Peak Body Options Paper will present multiple options for the new body that consider work already undertaken by the sector, including insights and feedback from stakeholders on various options for a model.

Rather than looking for a single solution, this project will consider proposals that have already been put forward while further exploring options for a future ESO Peak Body to inform DVA's response. The Department has engaged Nous Group to conduct the latest round of consultation, including through a survey

(https://nousgroupau.qualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_1AfcJSDMoQkHP4W) that seeks feedback from a range of stakeholders to understand how veterans and families interact with organisations that provide veteran and family advocacy support.

Your views are important to DVA and will help to develop a shortlist of viable options for the establishment of an ESO Peak Body. Please complete the short 10-minute survey (https://nousgroupau.gualtrics.com/jfe/form/SV_1AfcJSDMoQkHP4W).

The survey is open until 19 July 2024. The information from this survey will be stored securely and kept confidential. No personal details will be collected -all responses are anonymous and will be used only for research purposes. Your opinion will help to inform what a future peak body does and how.





RAEME Recovery Mechanics Memorial - Dotswood, North Queensland

It is now three years since the tragic passing of WO2 Ryan Leslie and Craftsman Brendon Payne. We remember two superb soldiers who died while serving their country on a military exercise at the Townsville Field Training Area on 30 August 2021.

RAEME Recovery Mechanics Memorial - Dotswood, North Queensland Cont.

Ryan and Brendon were cherished by their families, friends, and military comrades. Their loss has been deeply felt across the RAEME community and beyond. Commemorations held at the accident site on the first anniversary of their passing highlighted the importance of having a place to remember them—a place to reflect on their lives and honour their memory.
